3. FIATA Participates in UNCTAD's 1st International Forum for Trade Facilitation Committee

More than 300 participants from some 70 countries attended the week-long meeting. The participants represented public sector agencies such as the Ministry of Trade and the Customs Authority as well as the private sector. Women represented one third of participants. FIATA's Customs Affairs Chair, Mr. Stephen Morris participated on a panel underlining that a change of mind-set is needed on who to involve in trade facilitation discussions. He also stressed that NTFC-members need further training on the TFA and its benefits for driving economic growth.

5. WTO's Trade Facilitation Agreement Enters into Force

A major milestone for the global trading system was reached on 22nd of February 2017 when the first multilateral deal concluded in the 21-year history of the World Trade Organization entered into force. In receiving four more ratifications for the Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA), the WTO has obtained the two-thirds acceptance of the agreement from its 164 members needed to bring the TFA into force. 7. WCO Partners with WTO to Help National Committees on Trade Facilitation

The French session of the WTO Advanced Course for Chairs of National Committees on Trade Facilitation (NCTFs) was held from 30th of January to 10th of February 2017 at the World Trade Organization (WTO) in Geneva, Switzerland. The course benefitted over 23 government officials from 20 French-Speaking countries and from the secretariat of the Central Africa Monetary and Economic Community. The WTO invited

the WCO to co-facilitate this workshop in partnership with the World Bank Group, World Economic Forum, UNECE, UNCTAD, ITC and IATA.

Commissioner Cecilia Malmström and Japanese Foreign Affairs Minister Fumio Kishida met last week in Bonn to discuss the way forward for the negotiation of a Free Trade Agreement between the EU and Japan. Both parties reaffirmed their commitment to reach a highly comprehensive and ambitious agreement as early as possible. Both parties also confirmed their commitment to concluding in parallel a Strategic Partnership Agreement, to ensure that the whole EU-Japan relationship is consolidated and made fit for current challenges.

11. European Commission Welcomes Parliament's Support of Trade Deal with Canada

Last week the European Parliament voted in favour of the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) between the EU and Canada, concluding the ratification process of this deal at the EU level. CETA creates new opportunities for EU companies. It will save EU businesses over €500 million a year currently paid in tariffs on goods that are exported to Canada. Almost 99% of these savings start from day one.
