12. ICAO Council Adopts new CO₂ Emissions Standard for Aircraft

The 36-State ICAO Council has adopted a new aircraft CO₂ emissions standard which will reduce the impact of aviation greenhouse gas emissions on the global climate. The Standard will apply to new aircraft type designs from 2020, and to aircraft type designs already in-production as of 2023. Those inproduction aircraft which by 2028 do not meet the standard will no longer be able to be produced unless their designs are sufficiently modified.

13. UNFCCC - Singapore to Adopt Carbon Tax from 2019

At Budget 2017, the Singapore Government announced its intent to implement a carbon tax on the emission of greenhouse gases. They will consult widely with stakeholders, and aim to implement the carbon tax from 2019. The government has started industry consultations and will continue to reach out to companies to hear their views. Public consultations will begin in March 2017.

14. EU Emissions Trading System: Council Negotiates with Parliament

EU environment ministers reached an agreement in support of the revision of the Emissions Trading Systems (ETS) Directive for the period after 2020. The agreement comes after almost two years of discussions in the Council, led since the start of this year by the Maltese presidency, and serves as the basis for negotiations with the European Parliament.

15. ADB - Asia Infrastructure Needs Exceed \$1.7 Trillion Per Year

The ADB report, Meeting Asia's Infrastructure Needs, focuses on the region's power, transport, telecommunications, and water and sanitation infrastructure. Of the total climate-adjusted investment needs over 2016-2030, \$14.7 trillion will be for power and \$8.4 trillion for transport.

It was also cited that regulatory and institutional reforms are needed to make infrastructure more attractive to private investors and generate a pipeline of bankable projects for public-private partnerships (PPPs).
