DSLV (Germany): Axel Plass elected new President; DSLV's "Young Talent Award for Forwarding and Logistics" goes to Marc Bernhardt

The general meeting of the German Forwarding and Logistics Association (DSLV) held in Munich this year, elected Axel Plass (52) as president on 14 September 2018 by a large majority for the next three years. The Hamburg entrepreneur succeeds Mathias Krage, who led the Federal Association for nine years.

Plass, already a member of the DSLV Presidency since 2016, defined the focus of his term as follows: "The freight forwarding and logistics market represented by the DSLV is part of Germany's third-largest industry with 580,000 employees and more than 100 billion euros in turnover. The systemic importance of logistics must be reflected much more clearly in German and also in European economic policy. For this reason, I see it as my most important task to emphasize the importance of freight forwarding services for our economy and Germany as an economic and logistics location to policy-makers and the public and to assert our demands for a logistics-friendly environment."

This year's DSLV "Young Talent Award for Forwarding and Logistics" goes to Marc Bernhardt. The 21-year-old, who completed his training as a merchant for freight forwarding and logistics services at Kuehne + Nagel in Haiger, was honoured at the Entrepreneurs Day of DSLV on 14 September 2018 in Munich. As a national winner, Bernhardt has qualified for participation in the 'International Young Professionals Award' of FIATA.

#### BIFA (UK): Changes to the way UK forwarders trade with the European Union

British International Freight Association reported that the UK government has reached agreement with the EU on the vast majority of withdrawal issues, including the terms of an implementation period. Full agreement on this will mean that trading with the EU during the implementation period would broadly stay the same from the end of March 2019 until 31 December 2020.

If UK leaves the EU without a deal in March 2019, there would be immediate changes to the way UK businesses trade with the EU. This includes:

- . UK businesses having to apply customs, excise and VAT procedures to goods traded with the EU, in the same way that already applies for goods traded outside of the EU.
- . Trading partners in the EU having to apply customs, excise and VAT procedures to goods they receive from you, in the same way that they do for goods received from outside of the EU.

#### UFFA (Uganda): Freight and logistics through the years

Uganda's freight and logistics industry started with the building of the Uganda Railway (1896 - 1901). At the time, the major purpose of the railway was to transport copper at Kilembe mines. Coming all the way from Mombasa, the railway made things possible, especially for those along the railway line.

"The biggest challenge is that we don't have a port of our own so we are taxed by Kenya," says Hussein K. Kiddedde, chairman of the Uganda Freight Forwarders Association (UFFA), which brings together 114 freight and forwarding companies in the country. Kiddedde further notes that unlike other regions with well-established rail transport systems, Uganda uses road transport, which is very costly in terms of transporting cargo. "This complicates the logistics and transport system," Kiddedde adds.

#### Europe: Joint industry position on maritime single window

On 10 September, a coalition of European organisations in maritime logistics including CLECAT, ECASBA, EMPA, ESC, ESPO, FEPORT and IPCSA issued a joint position paper welcoming the Commission proposal for a Regulation which established a European Maritime Single Window environment (EMSWe).

The associations welcome the efforts of the Commission in reducing burdens in maritime transport by repealing the Reporting Formalities Directive (RFD). They also fully endorse the decision to replace the Directive with a Regulation as this truly ensures the harmonisation and interoperability. They also welcome the fact that the chosen policy option respects the existing set-up of National Single Windows and makes use of the investments already made and other important good intentions expressed.

#### USA: As Florence approaches, the importance of seaports

The primary large seaport in the path of Hurricane Florence as of Thursday appears to be the Port of Charleston, though the smaller Port of Wilmington to the north is more likely to suffer a more direct hit, the Port of Virginia is far from off the hook, and the larger Port of Savannah to the south will almost certainly feel the storm's wrath.

These are all important seaports, Charleston for the automotive and aerospace trade, Wilmington for its defense-related trade, Virginia for pharma and automotive trade, and Savannah for its ties to China. All told, they are handling slightly more than 6.4% of all U.S. trade this year and 14% of seaport trade.

## China: Typhoon Mangkhut moves into Mainland China after lashing Hong Kong

Typhoon Mangkhut began weakening after it made landfall in China and left Hong Kong with roads blocked, buildings damaged and low-lying areas flooded. The death toll in the Philippines rose to more than 50.

Almost 900 flights were canceled in Hong Kong on Sunday due to the typhoon, while bus and ferry services as well as express train service to the airport have been suspended, the Hong Kong government said. Underground trains are running at reduced intervals with stations largely empty. In China, all flights at Guangzhou International Airport were canceled from midday Sunday through Monday morning.

# ICAO: Air cargo event underscores pressing need for modernization, liberalization, and new efficiencies

Air freight volumes will grow at a healthy rate of 4.2 % annually through to 2032, but only if current air cargo modernization continues to be robustly and cooperatively pursued by governments and industry. This was conveyed by ICAO Secretary General Dr. Fang Liu at the latest Air Cargo Development Forum in Zhengzhou, China.

"With current consumer expectations for same day or next day delivery driving a great deal of today's growth in e-commerce and air freight, we cannot allow the speed and efficiency of commercial operations to be impeded due to network capacity shortfalls or other infrastructure-related risks," Dr. Liu said, adding that governments everywhere now have much greater investment certainty thanks to the guidance, targets and indicators reflected in ICAO's strategic global plans.

#### Moderation in demand momentum amid softer demand drivers

International Air Transport Association (IATA) reported that: annual growth in air freight tonne kilometres (FTKs) slowed to 2.8% in the three months ended July - its slowest pace on this basis in more than two years. While FTKs are continuing to increase in seasonally adjusted (SA) terms, the upward trend has slowed markedly from that seen during the best of the upturn in air freight last year.

Cargo yields have continued to trend upwards in H2 2018, albeit at a slower pace than a year ago. While the industry-wide load factor is trending down, ongoing high rates of freighter aircraft utilization will continue to help to reduce average costs, and to help offset ongoing upward pressure on costs, particularly from higher fuel prices.

#### Air freight peak season takes off, with the transpacific off to a strong start

Peak season has hit the transpacific air freight sector, with forwarders reporting increased rates and tight capacity. "The US market is booming, air freight rates have increased and space is tight," said one Asian forwarder.

The public comment period for the new round of tariffs ended last week and the US government said it was finalising plans to add up to 25% tariffs on \$200bn of Chinese goods.

## European road haulage capacity at 'historically low' level

Available transport capacity is fluctuating around a historically low level, pushing European road freight rates upwards, while hikes in fuel prices and driver shortages are also driving hauliers' operating costs higher, according to the latest quarterly data published by Capgemini and Transporeon, which tracks transport market dynamics.

"In the second quarter, transportation costs reached the record of Q4 2017. More importantly, the transportation costs could further rise to a new record high in the second half of this year. This is a direct result of continuously rising fuel and driver costs while at the same time transport demand increases across all industries," said Lars Vitters, supply chain manager at Capgemini Consulting.

#### IRU: Digital transport rolls out across key trade corridors

International Road Union reported that the regional trade and transport seminar in Baku, Azerbaijan in beginning of September accelerated the creation of fully digital TIR corridors across Eurasia, with the outcomes of recent pilot operations and TIR's intermodal capacity in the spotlight.

Seminar participants, including senior customs officials and TIR associations, analysed the results and expansion of pilot projects between Turkey and Iran; Georgia and Turkey; Turkey and Ukraine; and along the Batumi corridor (linking Ukraine, Georgia, Azerbaijan and Kazakhstan). Going a step further, there was also work to draft a regional cooperation agreement on TIR digitalisation.
